*Reminders – Parents must continue to monitor their children's health. *Bus information – Shuttle buses will be used every day. RLHS students will get on a shuttle bus here and ride to Walden High School. Then, students will board their assigned buses to go home.

Route updates are continually posted on the **FirstView app** by the transportation department. These changes may be posted on the day they occur, so it is important for you to regularly monitor the information. If/when RLHS is informed of changes, they will be noted in JMC. We do not always receive the notifications in advance, so please refer to the app.

- *Text messages If you receive a text message from the school, please do not reply to it via text or do not send a text message to that number. We will not receive it.
- *Lunch money Students must put lunch money into the box by the Main Office by 8 a.m. for it to be credited before lunch orders are taken. Please provide a check or the correct amount of cash. Change will not be made.
- *The 9th Hour runs from 2:30 p.m. until 3:15 p.m. If a student is on a teacher's F list, he/she will be required to attend 9th Hour on the appropriate day the following week.

If a student is required to attend, the family is responsible for transportation home. The student should leave the building promptly at **3:15 p.m.** If a student is involved in an after-school activity or sport, he/she may not attend that activity until the help session is over. When the student achieves a passing grade, he/she will no longer be required to attend the **9**th **Hour.**

*To order your yearbook – Books are received in June, but must be purchased in advance. The cost of the yearbook is \$60. In the JMC parent Portal, select Tuition/Fees on the left and then Purchase Items in the blue box at the top. You can then choose yearbook. You are not able to make purchases from a phone, so you must login using a computer. You can also mail in a check. If you are unsure if you have already purchased a yearbook, check your JMC parent portal under Tuition/Fees for your purchase history.

*Thrift Shop – Volunteers are needed to keep the store open. Students, parents, grandparents, and friends of RLHS are needed to sort, clean, price and display merchandise and work in the store. Please consider setting aside a morning or afternoon each month to help our faithful Thrift Shop volunteers serve RLHS.

Each RLHS family is expected to serve at least six hours (two complete shifts) of their total service hours (minimum 20 total) at the Thrift Shop. Currently, the Thrift Shop is open Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays and is looking for help during morning shifts (10 a.m. – 1 p.m.) and afternoon shifts (1 p.m. – 4 p.m.). *Spring sports – It is time to get your registration in order for spring sports. Athletes cannot begin participation in practice until students are registered for their sport. To get a registration card, all the following must be turned in to the Athletic Office:

- 1) A physical exam is required of all student-athletes for the first and third year of high school participation. OR
- 1a) An alternate year card is required of all student-athletes for the second and fourth year of high school participation.

OR

1b) The WIAA has granted relief for any student-athlete that is not able to get a physical this summer but has passed one within the past two years. This would typically apply to juniors who had a physical their freshman year or for incoming freshmen. The form for athletes in this situation is found here: https://www.wiaawi.org/Portals/0/PDF/Health/WIAA-Physical-Extension.pdf
A copy of a passed physical exam is still required to be on file with the school.

- 2) Sign and return the Lutheran High Athletics Agreement and the Concussion Information and Acknowledgement Form which includes the Lutheran High Athletics Policies, WIAA Policies, the Metro Classic Conference Sportsmanship guidelines, the Ascension All Saints Athletic Training Consent for Care and Treatment, and student/parent concussion information. Please read the Athletic Handbook prior to signing this form.
- 3) Pay Participation Fee These fees are used to offset some of the cost for transportation, officials, and equipment. The participation fee is \$125 per season with a cap of \$375 per year for a family (Boys tennis co-op: \$200 made out to St. Catherine's). This fee does not cover the cost of hats, socks, etc. AGAIN, PLAYERS MAY NOT PARTICIPATE IN PRACTICE UNTIL ALL FORMS AND FEES HAVE BEEN TURNED IN TO THE ATHLETIC OFFICE.

All forms can be found on the Racine Lutheran website at RacineLutheran.org. Click "Athletics" and print out the appropriate forms. Please note that the forms only need to be turned in once each school year.

April 19--Baseball, softball, track and field, and golf practices began.

April 26--Girls soccer practice began.

May 3--Boys tennis practice begins.

- *Please note the following **policy changes** that we have put into place this year because of **quarantine regulations**:
- 1) Dual-sport participation is not being allowed at all.
- 2) Ineligible students are not allowed to take part in any team activities during the period of ineligibility.

RACINE ROTARY POST PROM 2021 - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Before Prom: Buy your tickets and make sure you have your Student ID.

RLHS Seniors can purchase Prom tickets from Wednesday morning, April 28, through Monday, May 3, at 3:00pm. The cost is \$50 per ticket. (No discount for multiple tickets.) Purchase them from Mr. Gasau in Room 129.

Prom: Saturday, May 15th at Racine County Fairgrounds, 6pm - Midnight

<u>What to Expect</u>: LiveTV red carpet! Bleachers with screaming fans! Games like WipeOut, axe throwing, wrecking ball, Pop a Shot basketball, golf, skee ball, scavenger hunt, virtual games, music, karaoke, food, amazing decorations, and more!

<u>Tickets</u>: There will be no Pre-Prom event at RLHS. Pick up your ticket/wristband at Case H.S. Look for Mr. Gasau and Mrs. Schulz at our RLHS table. You must have your Student ID for entry and wear your wristband at the event.

Your ticket is a wristband that is coded with your student information. For your safety, all bags will be searched, and prom-goers screened before they enter Rotary Post Prom. Your arrival and departure time will be scanned into our system. All Post Prom-goers must be checked in and out.

Motorcade: You should arrive at Case H.S. at the designated time given by your school.

Safety is the primary consideration. Animal-drawn vehicles and animal riders are not permitted. Riding in trunks or trailers is not permitted. Riding on top of vehicles of any kind is not permitted. Violators will be ticketed immediately. Only street-legal vehicles and lawful riding, as defined by statute, is permitted. Motorcade will enter RCFG via back entrance off Hwy 45. If you have an adult planning to drive your motorcade vehicle home once you arrive, they should enter off Hwy 11 and meet you at the motorcade circle next to the bleachers. Prom goers can "drop a car" at the RCFG on Saturday, May 15th between 9am – 4pm. Enter off Hwy 45 and park in sections 20 and up only!

Parents & spectators are welcome to watch this year's Rotary Post Prom Parade in person from the bleachers

with a <u>pre-purchased</u> \$10/ticket only. We apologize but NO complimentary standing seats are available. Visitors

must enter off of Hwy 11 and park in that northern designated section of the parking lot only.

<u>Spectators Watching from Home:</u> Rotary Post Prom will be broadcast live by WCGV, My24 TV, and will stream live online at: <u>www.my24milwaukee.com</u> You can watch the live coverage on either platform from 6 – 9pm.

Event Rules: You must be a senior of a participating school or their +1 to be able to attend. All attendees must be under 21 years old. You must be eligible under your school's policy to attend. Alcohol or use of Intoxicants is illegal, and violators will be subject to the law. No sexually provocative dancing. No gang colors, clothing, signs, symbols, handshakes, language or other audible signs of gang membership or affiliation. No baseball caps or hats can be worn other than top hats. No flashing or throwing money or objects considered to be outward signs of gang affiliation. No smoking on the grounds. This includes e-cigarettes. You MUST wear a mask at all times (other than on the red carpet). If you are experiencing symptoms of Covid-19, have been exposed to someone who has tested positive, please refrain from attending for the safety of your follow seniors and their quests.

<u>Recommendations:</u> Please remember this is park terrain – mostly paved but some areas are damaged or uneven. We recommend appropriate footwear. There is no coat check this year; nurse & seamstress will be onsite.
