**\*Lunch Balances** – If you have received an invoice about owing a lunch balance from this past year, please pay it promptly. Please be aware that families are notified through JMC every time their lunch balance becomes negative. Our new policy will be that students who owe a lunch balance of \$25 or more will have their account locked in the lunchroom and will be unable to purchase food items at school.

**\*RLHS Volunteer/Family Service Hours** – Every family is expected to volunteer at least 20 hours of service each school year (July 1-June 30) to directly benefit RLHS. The Thrift Shop is open Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays and is looking for help during morning shifts (10 a.m.-1 p.m.) and afternoon shifts (1 p.m.-4 p.m.). In addition to the Thrift Shop, there are many volunteer opportunities available including athletic events (concessions, gate, stats, football chain gang), theatre productions (tickets, concessions), Golf Outing, Harvest Fair, and Grand Gala. We are grateful for your service.

**\*This is a reminder that athletes must be in school all day to participate in practice or games that day. Exceptions for school-sponsored field trips, college visits, funerals, doctor's appointments, etc., may be granted by the Athletic Director.**

**\*All Spring sports uniforms** should have been turned in at this point. Missing uniforms accrue a \$1 per day late fee.

**\*Volunteers needed** – The return of home RLHS events is near! We need parental volunteer help to staff our home games. Many different options are available and count toward your required service hours. You can view and sign up to help using the following link and directions.

Note: SignUp.com does not share your email address with anyone. If you prefer not to use your email address, please contact Mr. Shaffer, and he can sign you up manually.

**\*Fall sports are here!** Athletes cannot begin participation in practice until students are registered for their sport. To get a registration card, all the following must be turned in to the Athletic Office:

- 1) A physical exam is required of all student-athletes for the first and third year of high school participation. OR  
1a) An alternate year card is required of all student-athletes for the second and fourth year of high school participation.
- 2) Sign and return the Lutheran High Athletics Agreement and the Concussion Information and Acknowledgement Form which includes the Lutheran High Athletics Policies, WIAA Policies, the Metro Classic Conference Sportsmanship guidelines, the Ascension All Saints Athletic Training Consent for Care and Treatment, and student/parent concussion information. Please read the Athletic Handbook prior to signing this form.
- 3) Pay Participation Fee – These fees are used to offset some of the cost for transportation, officials, and equipment. The participation fee is \$150 per season with a cap of \$450 per year for a family (Boys volleyball and girls tennis co-op: \$200 made out to St. Catherine's). This fee does not cover the cost of hats, socks, etc.

All forms need to be turned in once per school year. These forms can be picked up at school or found online [here](#) on the school website.

AGAIN, PLAYERS MAY NOT PARTICIPATE IN PRACTICE UNTIL ALL FORMS AND FEES HAVE BEEN TURNED IN TO THE ATHLETIC OFFICE.
