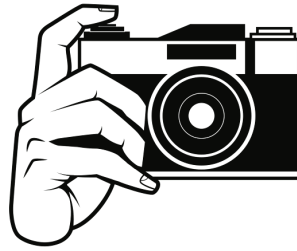

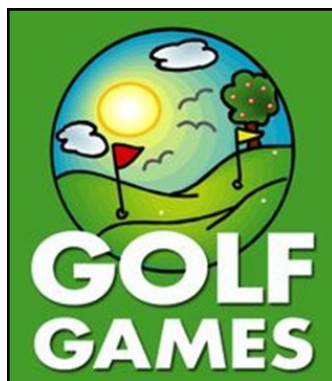

RLHS ATHLETICS

Crusader athletics began in 1947 with the organization of a baseball and boys basketball team, followed shortly by a football program in 1952. Girls' sports (volleyball, basketball, and softball) were added in 1974. Currently RLHS sponsors 18 WIAA varsity sports (9 boys & 9 girls), as well as 2 non-WIAA varsity sports (Coed). RLHS was a member of the Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association (WISAA) from 1968 to 2000. They became a member of the WIAA when it merged with WISAA in 2000. The Crusaders have been a member of three conferences (Midwest Preps 1950-1983, Midwest Classic Conference 1983-2012, Metro Classic Conference 2012-present)

Included in the many accomplishments of Crusader teams:

- 9 WISAA Team State Championships
- 54 Individual State Championships (53 WISAA, 1 WIAA)
- 14 Team State Runner-Ups (11 WISAA, 3 WIAA)
- 2 Sectional Championships
- 44 Regional Championships
- 65 Conference Championships
- 19 Athletes have been recognized as the Racine County Player of the Year since 1979.
- Coaches have been named Racine County Coach of the Year 28 times since 1978.

2025-26 Team Highlights

- Football — MCC Champions (9th Time in school history)
- Boys Basketball — MCC Champions (23rd Time in school history and 2nd season in a row)
- Softball — MCC Champions (8th Time in school history and 4th season in a row)
